2. What has been the most powerful aspect of working the steps?

The AA Principles

Honesty: Step 1. We admitted that we were powerless over alcohol - that our lives had become unmanageable.

Hope: Step 2. Came to believe that a power greater than ourselves greathan ourselves could restore us to sanity.

Faith: Step 3. Made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood him.

Courage: Step 4. Made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves.

Integrity: Step 5. Admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.

Willingness: Step 6. Were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character.

Humility: Step 7. Humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings.

Brotherly Love: Step 8. Made a list of all persons we had harmed, and became willing to make amends to them all.

Discipline: Step 9. Made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others.

Perseverance: Step 10. Continued to take personal inventory and when we were wrong promptly admitted it.

Spirituality: Step 11. Sought through prayer & meditation to improve our conscious contact with God as we understood Him, praying only for knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out.

Service: Step 12. Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to others, especially alcoholics and to practice these principles in all our affairs.
