### The AA Principles

**Honesty: Step 1.** We admitted that we were powerless over alcohol - that our lives had become unmanageable.

**Hope: Step 2.** Came to believe that a power greater than ourselves greathan ourselves could restore us to sanity.

**Faith: Step 3.** Made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood him.

**Courage: Step 4.** Made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves.

**Integrity: Step 5.** Admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.

**Willingness: Step 6.** Were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character.

**Humility: Step 7.** Humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings.

**Brotherly Love: Step 8.** Made a list of all persons we had harmed, and became willing to make amends to them all.

**Discipline: Step 9.** Made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others.

**Perseverance: Step 10.** Continued to take personal inventory and when we were wrong promptly admitted it.

**Spirituality: Step 11.** Sought through prayer & meditation to improve our conscious contact with God as we understood Him, praying only for knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out.

**Service: Step 12.** Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to others, especially alcoholics and to practice these principles in all our affairs.
